Habitat/Building/Land type	Species possibly present
Ancient or veteran trees (particularly with features of significant decay)	Bats, breeding birds, dormice, invertebrates
Cellars, follies, disused mines and caves	Bats
Buildings with lifted or missing roof tiles or other access points	Bats, breeding birds
Large gardens in suburban and rural areas	Bats, breeding birds, badgers, reptiles, great crested newts
Traditional timber-framed buildings (such as barns)	Bats, breeding birds
Lakes, rivers and streams (and adjacent/nearby land)	Breeding birds, fish (including migratory species), otters, water voles, white-clawed crayfish
Heathland (on or near to site)	Breeding birds, badgers, dormice, reptiles, invertebrates, protected plant species
Meadows, grassland, parkland and pasture	Bats, breeding birds, badgers, great crested newts, invertebrates, reptiles, protected plants
Ponds or slow-flowing water bodies (including ditches) on site, or within 500m of the site and linked by semi-natural habitats	Breeding birds, fish, great crested newts, water voles, invertebrates, white-clawed crayfish
Rough grassland and previously developed land (brownfield sites) on or adjacent to the site	Breeding birds, amphibians, reptiles, invertebrates, protected plants
Woodland, scrub and hedgerows on or adjacent to the site	Bats, breeding birds, badgers, dormice, invertebrates, great crested newts, reptiles, protected plants
Estuarine habitats	Breeding birds, fish (including migratory species), otters, invertebrates
