

There was quite a large space that to fill and it was agreed this should be with a piece of equipment that would be more appropriate for some of the older children (ie age 9-11) in the village, as the current equipment was very much aimed at the younger children. A "Witches Hat" type climbing apparatus was eventually agreed upon.


