
Stroud District Q1-4

The wider picture for carbon reduction is difficult with old Victorian townhouses in the towns and stone cottages in rural areas that are notoriously difficult to make energy efficient, yet are a core part of the 'best place to live in Britain' appeal.

Under the October 2022 Energy Price Guarantee, an estimated 18% of the district are expected to be in fuel poverty. We have calculated that up to 28% of households could be under "fuel stress" - spending over 10% of their income on energy bills.





- 62% of households supported have a least one health condition
- The largest amount of funding unlocked this year from a single scheme is £63,221 through the Household Support Fund
- £56,604 of ECO4 funding has been unlocked in the Stroud District since April 2023
- 43 measures have been installed improving the energy efficiency of 28 homes
