We respectfully request that a District Wide Policy be put into the Local Plan going forward regarding the designation of Local Green Spaces.

We also urge Stroud District Council to designate the area known as Baxters' Fields, to the north of Summer Street, Stroud as Local Green Space (at the very minimum). Ideally we believe this area should be incorporated fully into the AONB rather than just being within the setting of an AONB.

This area remains under constant threat of development from opportunistic developers or builders. People of far and wide value this Open Space for its' landscape and literary connections. Local Green Spaces are also vital for the health and wellbeing of everyone.
