Dear Sirs

I would like to state that I do not support Stroud District Council's latest Local Plan & in particular object to the planned development of around 1500 houses at so-called 'Wistoe Green'.

I have lived in Cambridge for over 50 years. Volume of traffic has always been a problem, alleviated for a short time by the construction of the M5 Motorway. High levels of development in Cam, Dursley & further afield, loss of employment in agriculture & in small towns like Dursley, have increased traffic with workers now commuting to Gloucester, Cheltenham & Bristol etc. At rush hours it is very difficult & dangerous to cross the A38 & also to access it. How much worse it will be if 'Wistoe Green' is approved. Each household will have at least one car. It will be grid lock.

The developers claim that residents will walk or cycle to Cam & Dursley, Statia to get to work. Anyone who

who live here will tell you that next to Long No-one walks or cycles to CamStation. If they drive here is only a small car park, commuter trains are small & packed. In fact only around 1% of the local population travel to work by train thus increasing pressure on the roads.

A Junior School is the only additional facility shown on the developed plans. Secondary education is not mentioned & pressure on medical other services is not addressed. Medical facilities for instance will be overstretched. It is already difficult to see your own GP & the queues at pharmacies get ever longer. Facilities & infrastructure need to be in place before building & not, hopefully afterwards.

The Berkeley Vale has always been primarily an agricultural area. In present unpredictable times, can we afford to cover acres of productive land with housing. I do not accept that a Grade 3 rating of the land as accurate.

Slinbridge & the surrounding area is obviously wet land, hence the name & the number of old watermeadows that surround the village. With a huge development on already wet, flat & ill drained land, problems have to get worse. Who would want to live in a swamp next to a very busy motorway with everlasting noise & traffic?

Shimbridge + other villages voted in, LOR
favour of spreading development fairly
throughout the area. People need homes but
not on large artificially engineered developments
far from their work. Could Strand D.C.
reconsider their desire to overlook past
plans + adopt policies, which are more
fair to rural communities where
long distance commutes can be lessened
& the environment less threatened
