Is this above the Government requirement?, yes again. I am having trouble a the moment crossing the road now with all the traffic using the A38 through

Cambridge. We ask where are all these cars/people going? The answer is Gloucester and Bristol to work, as there is very little in Cam and Dursley and the jobs there are, are of lower pay and warehousing.

Will the problem of high traffic get worse with more housing, the answer will be yes.

What is the chances of SDC target of carbon neutral by 2030, I think none, unless you think that the traffic leaving our area for employment means it does not count in the SDC area?.

I believe dispersing the number of new build houses over a larger area of South SDC region, or where the jobs are located is the way forward, Hardwicke etc.

As a person who has lived in Cam and Cambridge all my life, I believe these area have already been over built, just look at Box Road and the number of houses being built now, plus the development that looks like being built around the Draycott area.

How can the infrastructure cope with more housing as we are struggling already.

Enough is enough for this area, unless the elected people at the SDC and planning dismiss the wants and wishes of their voters.

Recapping, I object to these proposals that SDC are planning for our area.
