PS16 AND PS42

The fields were farmed by the godsell family. Known as Mankley field until 2015. When building work commenced in 2015.

The crops were not harvested as the ground was to wet and left to rot on ps16 and ps42 the Basilica land is the wettest part of Mankley field. And since the building started it has got a lot wetter. That it is why it is called Marsh lane, it sprang a leek in the summer of 2019 by the village hall and created large pot holes. Thinking it was a sewer or water leak, it turns out to be water that may have been diverted from the building work in mankley fields. Up to now 5 attempts have been made to fix it.

Where I live in Dozule Close you cannot get off your drive at times as you are blocked in by the cars taking the children to school. And I have missed doctors appointments as I have been blocked in. And all you get from the parents is a load of abuse. And as for getting out off the village it is very difficult at the start of Dozule Close cars are parked around the bends that is where people visit High border lodge as there is very little parking in there ground. March road is solid with cars parked all down the road. Also the main Bath road is far more busier as a lot more cars are coming from Frocester and the roads are very narrow there is no proper car parks in Leonard Stanley.

I woud not like to see any more houses in the village as the roads are not suitable and the basilica field is far to wet. and would create more flooding elsewhere The youngster's play football on some Saturdays they used to park on the land at Broadmeadow but they built houses about 5 years ago there now. So this now creates problems parking on a weekend as it is several football teams and lots off cars.
