Civic Centre bike park Civic Centre Old Market Nailsworth GL6 0DU

Brief description of works undertaken:

A new bike park created with space for four bikes plus a 'bike pump station' (public bike pump).

Date Project Completed:

3rd March 2023.

Has the project been successful? How?

Yes. The bike racks were used almost immediately. The racks are now used regularly and so is the bike pump, making the town centre more welcoming for visiting cyclists. A group of cyclists regularly meet next to the bike racks for Summer after work bike rides.

Planters around the bike park have brought some biodiversity into the street, softening the look of the car park and offering extra protection from bikes being clipped by cars turning into the car parks.
