Hello

I'm writing to express an interest in the use of towpaths by cyclists. Of particular interest is the stretch of towpath on the Sharpness ship canal between Frampton-on-Severn to The Black Shed, Slimbridge. This forms part of the Sustrans National Cycle Route 41.

This stretch is often difficult to cycle on: narrow rideable lane, prone to being very slippery. The link between Frampton and Slimbridge is really important for cyclists going north / south or south / north. The alternative is the Perry Way and the A38, both relatively major roads with high speed vehicles and significant HGV usage. All that is required, ideally, is a 2m wide tarmac track; alternatively hardpack (must be well drained). This would also greatly assist pedestrians, in particular families and those with a disability.
