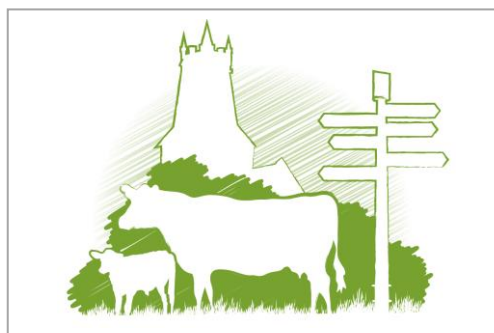

Project name and location:

Horsfall (Box Lane) Playground Improvements, Minchinhampton

Brief description of works undertaken:

The original playground had equipment which was largely outdated, surface degradation and the need for a re-design and investment to create an accessible, practical, inviting and inclusive recreation area for the local community. The new £65,000 playground funded by the Parish Council offers inclusive play experiences for all ages up to 12 and an inviting, social and fun space for local children and their families. The local community has worked together and put a huge amount of effort into making this project a reality, and the Council is looking forward to seeing the completed area being used and enjoyed for years to come.

Date Project Completed:

The playground was officially opened on Friday 15th March 2024

The new playground has been very well received by local stakeholders and feedback has been very positive – from both parents and children alike. It is in use far more often than it was prior to the refurbishment.
